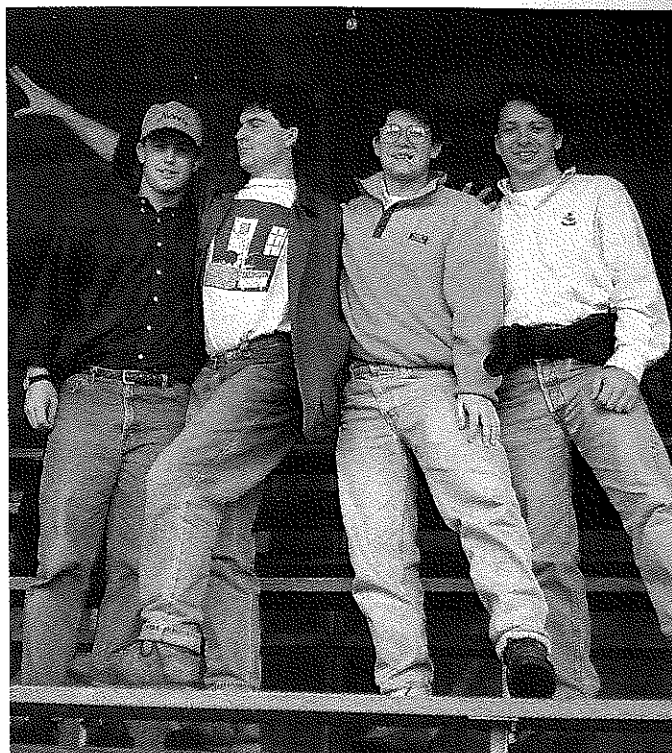
## Zete Social Life Still Strong Despite College Rules

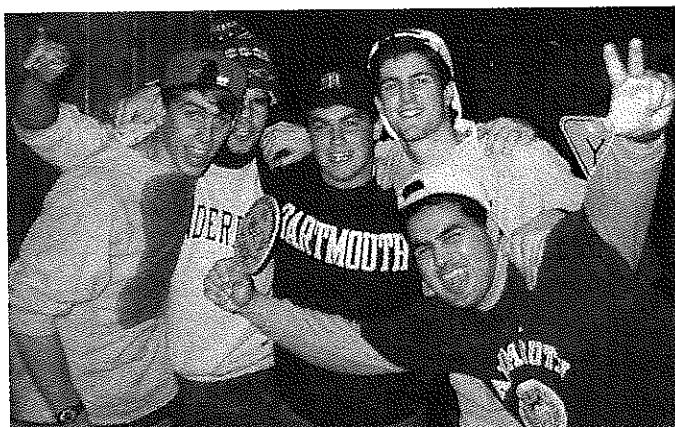
## Brothers Optimistic About This Year's Minimum Standards

For those of you who haven't heard, the tube room has been moved out of the basement and into the chapter room. In its place is a newly tiled floor and the pool table. This arrangement not only enlarges the basement but provides a measure of protection for the pool table, which has suffered no major damage since it was moved into its own room. The result of a recent pledge project, two beautiful and indestructible benches, have been added to the room to provide spectators a convenient place to sit while watching tension-filled matches. The installers were able to tie the washer into the existing plumbing, and, though it causes a few backups, the system seems to be working out well. That rounds out the recent house improvements, and I thank you for your donations, which make these improvements possible.
